

INTERMEDIATE PAPER-PIECING

Have you taken the beginner paper-piecing class and mastered all the concepts of that? Are you ready for something more difficult but not quite ready for a Judy Neimeyer pattern? This class may be just what you are looking for! In this two-part class, we'll be making a wall-size mariner's compass. In class one, we'll be constructing the parts of the compass using paper piecing techniques. In class two, we'll be putting the parts together.

(<u>Prerequisite</u>: Beginner Paper Piecing class or equivalent, and comfortable with the process)

Supply list:

Add-a-quarter ruler

Fabric glue stick

Old greeting card to help with paper folding

Little Bits – "Mariner's Compass" pattern by Cindi Edgerton

¼ yard (or fat quarters) of 4 different fabrics for compass points and flying geese

1 yd light background fabric

¼ yd medium fabric for accent area around the compass block

½ yd for setting triangle

1/8 yard each of 2 additional fabrics for geese for added variation

1 yard dark fabric for borders and binding



NOTE: please have pieces for compass blocks and flying geese triangles cut out BEFORE class begins
